CONCEPT

The legal and financial management of a research project can be an obstacle for a more and better concurrence in the existing programmes. As well, the preparation of the organizations internal systems to accomplish the rules of participation is not always easy.

Although there are structures that provide support to participate in H2020, the lack of a deep knowledge in legal and financial issues makes more difficult to fully accomplish the NCP objectives, since the managerial aspects used could jeopardize the natural development. Such complexity and lack of support can even decrease the leadership of the projects, and also discourage researchers to apply to this Programme and better opt to an easier one.

The aim of this workshop is to train NCPs whom will support applicants of Spreading Excellence and Widening participation projects in order to get a better participation in the Programme.
